

# College Options beginning your Junior Year - Bluegrass College Academy (BCA)

- BCTC-Georgetown Campus
- Full college course load (15 credit hours per semester)
- No classes at high school
- Full year commitment
- Scholarships available for at least 2 college classes
- Classes offered at a discounted rate
- Transportation provided
- Available only for Juniors to begin and continue through Senior year
- Leads to earning an Associates Degree

# Becoming Post Secondary Ready

- Earn an Industry Certification or EOP in a Pathway
- ACT Benchmarks
  - English: 18
  - Math: 19
  - Reading: 20
- Make a 3 or higher on AP Exam
- Pass a dual credit class with at least a C
- 300 Co-op/WEL Hours
